		<u>Amendment Summary</u> : Senate Energy, Agriculture & Natural Resources Committee amendment 1 (004699) deletes and rewrites language of the original bill such that the substantive change limits applicability to 501(c)(3) tax-exempt nonprofit organizations.
		<i>Fiscal Note:</i> (Dated March 8, 2021) Decrease Local Revenue Exceeds \$5,000,000/FY21-22 and Subsequent Years Other Fiscal Impact Local governments may increase storm water user fees charged to other customers to compensate, fully or partially, for recurring, mandatory, decreases in local revenue. 		<u>Amendment Summary:</u> Senate Energy, Agriculture & Natural Resources Committee amendment 1 (005307) deletes all language after the enacting clause. Prohibits the Commissioner of the Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) from approving any application for waste evaluation or recertification of waste evaluation that is submitted on or after July 1, 2021, that would authorize the disposal of sewage sludge that has not undergone aerobic or anaerobic digestion as specified in Environmental Regulations and Technology Control of Pathogens and Vector Attraction in Sewage Sludge , EPA 625/R-92/013, rev. July 2003, in a Class I landfill when the sewage
		sludge does not originate from the same county as the county where the landfill is located, unless approved by a two-thirds vote of the legislative body in which the landfill is located. Requires that any approval by such legislative body must specifically authorize disposal of undigested sewage sludge, which is imported from outside the county, in a Class I landfill located in the county. Establishes that a county or municipal legislative body s general authorization to locate a Class I landfill in the county is not sufficient to authorize the Commissioner of the TDEC to approve any application for waste evaluation or recertification of waste evaluation, as aforementioned. HB871 Campbell S.	<b>LOCAL GOVERNMENT: Open pit mines and quarries - exemption from local regulations.</b> Establishes that formerly operating pit mines or quarries that agree to receive fill or borrow material from state highway construction projects are exempt from local regulations that limit the operator's ability to fill the pit and reclaim and restore the site. Requires the fill work to comply with the Tennessee Water Pollution Control Act and the applicable state rules.
		<u>Amendment Summary:</u> Senate Energy, Agriculture & Natural Resources Committee amendment 1 (004901) deletes and rewrites all language after the enacting clause such that the only substantive changes; replace formerly operating pit mine or quarry with former surface mining operation or operation as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. 59-8-202; and specify that such applicable restrictions, rules, regulations, ordinances, and laws, include, but are not limited to, prohibitive zoning, limits on truck traffic, weight limits or distance limitations or other operational limitations.

		deletes all language after the enacting clause. Requires the Tennessee Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (TACIR) to study certain aspects of non-fish and game recreational activities as they relate to certain operations of the Department of Environment and Conservation and the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency and report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly by December 31, 2022. Extends, from March 1 to March 15, the deadline by which a landowner must file with the assessor of property an application for land to be classified as agricultural, forest, or open space land and removes the ability for the assessor to void the rollback assessment if it is determined that the assessment was imposed in error. Broadly captioned.

Fiscal Note: (Dated January 26, 2021) Other Fiscal Impact The extent and timing of any shift in permissive local expenditures cannot reasonably be determined; however, the net fiscal impact to local government is considered not significant.  ENVIRONMENT & NATURE: Water Quality Control Act - permits. Requires the department of environment and conservation to take certain actions to ensure that in-lie fee sponsors secure mitigation for permanent impacts to waters. Allows the commissioner to assess the liability of any polluter or violator for damages to the state resulting from any person's pollution or violation, failure, or neglect in complying with any rules or standards of water quality promulgated by the board or permits, including failure by an in-lieu fee sponsor to timely complete land acquisition and initial physical and biological improvements. <u>Fiscal Note:</u> (Dated January 30, 2021) NOT SIGNIFICANT

<u>Caption:</u> AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 69, Chapter 3, Part 1, relative to water quality. SB1049 - S. Southerland - 03/15/21 - Senate passed.

4. HB1138 Grills R.
ENVIRONMENT & NATURE: West Tennessee River Basin Flood Resiliency Fund Act. Enacts the "West Tennessee River Basin Flood Resiliency Fund Act," which creates the West Tennessee River basin authority flooding resiliency fund. Establishes regulations regarding sources for the fund. Specifies that the fund can be used for flood control, flood risk reduction, stream and wetland restoration, water resource education and other uses for flood resiliency. Authorizes county mayors to appoint a designee to serve on the West Tennessee River basin authority board of directors.

UTILITIES: TPUC annual report to general assembly and governor. Requires the public utility commission to make an electronic copy of its annual report to the general assembly and governor available on its website and accessible to the general public. Broadly captioned. *Fiscal Note:* (Dated February 13, 2021) NOT SIGNIFICANT *Caption:* AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4; Title 7; Title 8; Title 13; Title 47, Chapter 18 and Title 65, relative to oversight of utility providers.
SB1572 - P. Bailey - 02/22/21 - Referred to Senate Commerce & Labor Committee. 5. HB390 Harris T.
UTILITIES: Policies governing discontinuation of service for nonpayment. Prohibits a utility governing body from discontinuing service on a day on which reconnections cannot take place within 24 hours or on the day preceding or following a legal holiday. Makes statewide the requirement for utilities to establish a policy governing discontinuation of service for nonpayment. In current law, requirement only applies to Davidson County. <u>Fiscal Note:</u> (Dated February 5, 2021) NOT SIGNIFICANT <u>Caption:</u> AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 7 and Title 65, relative to utilities.

6. HB1328 Harris T. **UTILITIES: Cutting off of service by a utility.** Prohibits a utility from cutting off an existing service at an address to establish a new service at the same address without the utility first contacting the registered customer with the existing service at the address and confirms the utility has the correct address; this would apply to all counties. Broadly captioned.
