**LOCAL GOVERNMENT: Open pit mines and quarries - exemption from local regulations.** Establishes that formerly operating pit mines or quarries that agree to receive fill or borrow material from state highway construction projects are exempt from local regulations that limit the operator's ability to fill the pit and reclaim and restore the site. Requires the fill work to comply with the Tennessee Water Pollution Control Act and the applicable state rules.

<u>Amendment Summary</u>: Senate amendment 1 (004901) deletes and rewrites all language after the enacting clause such that the only substantive changes; replace formerly operating pit mine or quarry with former surface mining operation or operation as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. 59-8-202; and specify that such applicable restrictions, rules, regulations, ordinances, and laws, include, but are not limited to, prohibitive zoning, limits on truck traffic, weight limits or distance limitations or other operational limitations.
